BORNEO ~ AN OVERVIEW

Borneo is an amalgam of bio-diversity that blends uncharted forests filled with yet-to-be discovered species, a plethora of endemic trees, orchids and other flora, and animals like you've never seen before anywhere. Since 1996, reportedly 361 new animal and plant species have been identified, supporting the ongoing efforts of international and local scientists to continue their explorations into the seven distinct eco-regions that make up the third largest island in the world (287,000 square miles). Currently, there are 288 terrestrial species, 394 freshwater fish species, 100 amphibian species, 15,000 flowering plant species, 3,000 tree species and 420 resident bird species. To put in another perspective, 40% of the world's palm species, 50% of the world's dipterocarp trees and 20% of the world's snakes are found only in Borneo. And for orchid lovers, this is a magical paradise of over 1,500 species in Sabah alone. Also, the world's largest orchid, the tiger orchid, the world's largest single flower, the *Rafflesia arnoldii*, and the world's largest composite flowers, the giant voodoo lily – are all found here. The island provides the only natural habitat for the endangered orangutan, and is a refuge for forest species, such as Asian elephant, Sumatran rhinoceros and Borneo clouded leopard. From the slopes of Mt. Kinabalu and the waters of the Kinabatangan River, to the primeval forests of Danum Valley, the romance and mystery of Borneo awaits you.

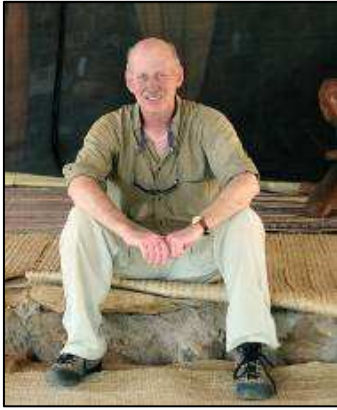


YOUR NATURALIST GUIDE~ ROBERT BASIUK

YOUR ITINERARY

DAYS 1/2~ MONDAY/TUESDAY~ MAY 7/8

INDIANAPOLIS/LOS ANGELES / EN ROUTE

Depart Indianapolis for Los Angeles where you connect with your late night Malaysia Airlines flight to Kota Kinabalu. En route, you'll cross the international dateline and lose one calendar day. (Meals Aloft)

DAY 3~WEDNESDAY~MAY 9

TAIPEI/KOTA KINABALU/SANDAKAN

Your flight arrives in Taipei this morning, where you connect with your flight to Kota Kinabalu, the capital of Sabah. Here board your flight to Sandakan, which was the capital of British North Borneo (now Sabah) until 1947, when it was supplanted by Kota Kinabalu. Upon arrival, check into your hotel and enjoy the rest of the evening at your leisure.

Nestled amid one of the world's last unspoiled rainforests, Sabah Hotel has lush foliage as a backdrop and exudes an alluring natural attraction as it blends in well with the rich flora and fauna of "The Land below the Wind." Each room has amenities such as en-suite facilities, television, telephone and hair dryers. You may want to dip your toes into the free-form swimming pool fed by a beautiful waterfall or visit the spa and sauna.

Overnight at the SABAH HOTEL. (Meals Aloft)

DAY 4~THURSDAY~MAY 10

SANDAKAN/SEPILOK ORANGUTAN REHABILITATION CENTER



Your day begins with a visit to Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Center. This endangered species is found only in Borneo and northern Sumatra – and is the only representative of the great apes outside central Africa. Orangutans live in forests where they build a new sleeping nest out of twigs and small branches daily. Their diet includes fruits, bark, leaves, durians, figs, rambutans, and insects. The orangutan can live up to 30 years, and the female can have three to four offspring in her lifetime. The youngsters learn to find their own food, build their own nest and move around by the time they are six or seven years old. The Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Center prides itself on returning orphaned and captive orangutans to the wild. Other protected animals brought to Sepilok include Malay sun bears, baby elephants, wild cats, and even crocodiles.

At Sepilok, the orangutans undergo a three-step process to learn to integrate socially and independently with the wild population of the forest. First, the animals are admitted to the Sepilok clinic for two months. This is designed to eliminate any exposure of communicable diseases for both orangutans and humans. Afterward, wildlife rangers teach the apes the necessary survival skills such as foraging for food. During the daily feeding time, you'll observe the orangutans as they playfully interact with each other and their environment.

At the age of seven, the wildlife staff continues to supply the orangutans with fruits and milk, but this food is only a dietary supplement. The primates have already begun to look for their own food, resulting in fewer orangutans returning to Sepilok. Those who do come swing in using branches and vines, creating an excellent opportunity to observe the orangutan in its natural habitat. Following lunch at the center headquarters, proceed to the playground area of the young orangutans. After you see where they are fed, walk to another area reserved for the feeding of the semi-wild and wild orangutans.

You'll also have a chance to visit Sim Sim Water Village, a village on stilts on the coast of Sandakan reachable by plank walkways that depicts the daily activities of some of the local fishermen families in their neat wooden houses. This is also the site of the original town of Sandakan that began in 1879. Overnights at the SABAH HOTEL. (B,L)

DAY 5~FRIDAY~MAY 11

LABUK BAY PROBOSCIS MONKEY SANCTUARY/SUKAU

Located among the mangrove forests of Samawang and just a short drive from Sandakan is the Labuk Bay Proboscis Monkey Sanctuary. As the name suggests, this is the place to see one of the most distinctive and unusual inhabitants of Borneo - the proboscis monkey.

You will arrive just in time for the morning feeding at 9:30am at Platform A. This sanctuary is within the Oil Palm estate and is privately owned, but it provides you the opportunity to observe these unique primates at a very close range. The males have big dangling noses, reddish flat-top hairstyles, white tails and markings, and pot bellies. The females, on the other hand, are much smaller and have up-turned noses.



Relax by the river before embarking on a boat excursion up-river along Sabah's longest river, Kinabatangan, with an opportunity to view wildlife and birds in its virgin mangrove and rainforest habitat. Search for some of the primates species, including proboscis monkeys as they settle down on treetops. Lunch is provided at the Abai Jungle Restaurant.

Nestled along the riverbank of Kinabatangan River lies Borneo Nature Lodge - an eco-friendly resort, offering the comfort without compromising the green. At the end of an exciting day, find comfort in your air-conditioned bedroom at the lodge, which comes with an attached bathroom as well as coffee-making facilities.



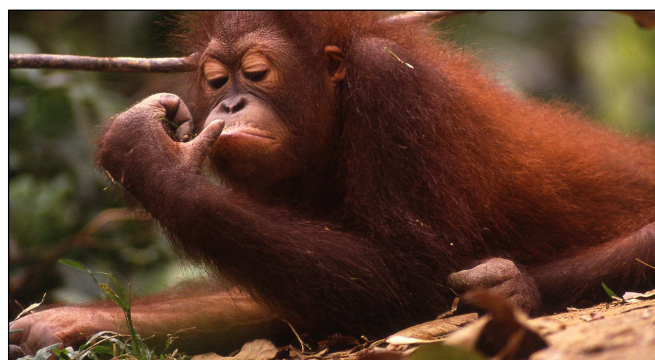
You will appreciate the 'green' details of the chalets built here - all electrical items run on solar power (with the exception of air conditioners) and energy-saving light bulbs are used throughout the lodge. You will notice a fixed glass feature that allows natural light to pour into your room. In honor of the indigenous people, many of the decorative items you find here are authentically handmade. The lodge currently has 12 rooms able to accommodate 24 guests at a time with an additional twin-sharing handicapped friendly room. The lodge also has a restaurant, giving diners a choice to eat indoors or al fresco.

DAY 6~SATURDAY~MAY 12

KINABATANGAN ORANGUTAN CONSERVATION PROJECT/SUKAU

Early this morning you will be awakened by the calls of gibbons and hornbills. Today you are off for a very special visit to the Kinabatangan Orangutan Conservation Project study site. Accompanied by nature guides, who are also trained research assistants with vast knowledge of orangutans and conservation work, you will trek the jungle to look for the red apes. This educational program offers unique insights into the involvement of local communities in the conservation effort to



protect these wonderful primates. The program includes interpretation of orangutan ecology, conservation efforts to protect the species, their floodplain habitat, including scientific studies, plus a reforestation initiative to connect degraded forest and increase tree species as food source for the orangutan. Although there are orangutans habituated in the study site, we do not guarantee sighting because they are wild and roam around freely.

After lunch, late in the afternoon, depart on a river cruise to observe the flora and fauna of the area. Overnight at the BORNEO NATURE LODGE. (B,L,D)

DAY 7~SUNDAY~MAY 13
OX BOW LAKE/SUKAU



After an early breakfast proceed to the Ox Bow Lake to observe wildlife and experience the early morning river ambience of the longest river of Sabah. Oxbow Lake is a crescent shaped body of water lying alongside the Kinabatangan River. The lake was created over time and separated from the main river as erosion and deposits of soil changed the river's course. The lake is ideal for bird watching, and sometimes orangutans are spotted in this quiet and serene area. Later in the morning, enjoy a special treat of sharing tea at one of the village houses. This is an opportunity to interact with the host and try your hand at playing a local musical instrument. After a tour of the village and a short jungle walk along the lake, return to the lodge for lunch. After lunch, depart on another river cruise to observe the flora and fauna of the area.

Overnight at the BORNEO NATURE LODGE. (B,L,D)

DAY 8~MONDAY~MAY 14
SUKAU/SANDAKAN/DANUM VALLEY

Return by boat to Sandakan and continue with your drive to Borneo Rainforest Lodge, located in Sabah's largest protected lowland forest, the Danum Valley Conservation Area, comprised of 108,230 acres of pristine virgin rain forest. The Dipterocarp forest found in Borneo is considered to be the world's tallest and oldest, having existed for over 100 million years. It is also one of world's richest areas for species variation with more than 200 tree species per 1,000 sq. feet! Within this paradise is a lodge designed by naturalists with magnificent views of forest mountains and the Danum River just below.



Although very difficult to spot, the conservation area nonetheless shelters more than 270 species of birds and 109 species of mammals, including Asian elephant, orangutan, five species of deer, and Bornean rarities such as Sumatran rhinoceros, clouded leopard, and the impressive Bulwer's pheasant. Danum Valley supports one of the largest remaining populations of wild orangutans. Although difficult to spot, you will have good chances of seeing them under the guidance of the lodge's expert trackers. Do remember that in spite of the diversity and large numbers of animals, most are extremely well camouflaged. But you will definitely see an incredible diversity of flora and fauna, including some of the world's largest butterflies and moths. It's impossible to say which animals you'll see. At some time during your visit, you're sure to happen

upon a delicate mouse deer or a snorting group of bearded pigs, to awaken to the haunting call of Bornean gibbons and glimpse giant flying squirrels gliding through the canopy.

The lodge itself has 28 twin-bedded rooms in 23 bungalows made of Borneo's famous hardwood. All have a balcony and en-suite facilities. The Borneo Rainforest Lodge is the perfect place to enjoy this beautiful environment.

Overnight at the BORNEO RAINFOREST LODGE. (B,L,D)

DAY 9~TUESDAY~MAY 15

DANUM VALLEY~COFFIN TRAIL/SEGAMA TRAIL/EAST TRAIL

Trek along the "coffin trail" to an ancient Kadazandusun burial site at Coffin Cliff. Climb 40 minutes to a magnificent look-out point for a bird's eye view over the Danum Valley and the Borneo lowland forest then descend to the Jacuzzi Pool for a refreshing dip followed by lunch at your lodge. In the evening, if weather permits, enjoy a night walk around the lodge in search of nocturnal animals.

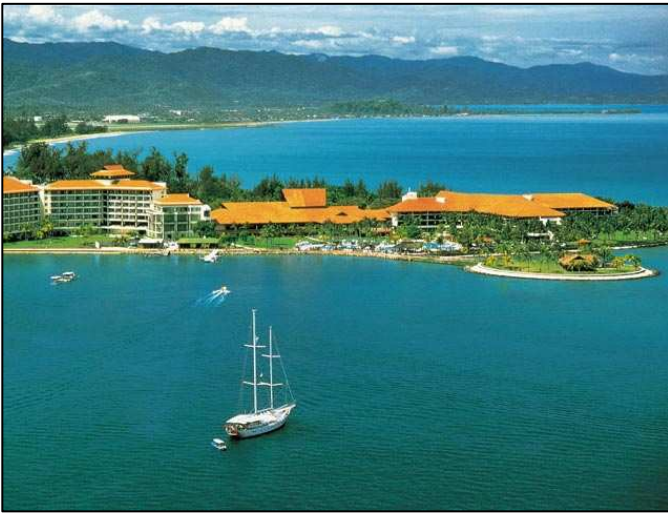


The luxury five-star Renaissance Kuala Lumpur Hotel is located in the heart of Kuala Lumpur's prestigious Golden Triangle, at the corner of Jalan Ampang and Jalan Sultan Ismail, amid the city's major commercial, financial, shopping and entertainment district. It is a short stroll to the Kuala Lumpur City Centre area, Petronas Twin Towers and Kuala Lumpur Tower.

DAY 10~WEDNESDAY~MAY 16

DANUM VALLEY/LAHAD DATU/KOTA KINABALU



Make the slow return to Lahad Datu from where you fly to Kota Kinabalu where you will overnight at the Shangri-La Tanjung Aru Beach Resort.

The original town was razed during World War II and a new, carefully planned town was built in its place. Sabah, Malaysia's second largest state, is mountainous with lush tropical forests. It is known as "Land Below the Wind" because it lies below the typhoon belt. As early as 600 AD, Chinese traders brought porcelain to Sabah to trade for local spices and bird's nests.

Although trade settlements were established, mass Chinese migration to Sabah only started in the 1880s after the formation of the British North Borneo Chartered Company. Today, Chinese make up the second largest ethnic group in Sabah. The largest indigenous group in Sabah is the Dunsun/Kadazan, followed by the Bajaus and the Muruts.

Check into your magnificent resort and have the rest of the day to relax and acclimate yourself to this lovely city. Nestled into 25 acres in the lap of Mt. Kinabalu, each of the guestrooms offers en-suite facilities, television, radio, mini-bar, tea and coffee making facilities and hair dryers. You may want to relax in the hotel's sauna, steam bath or swimming pool.

Overnight at the SHANGRI-LA TANJUNG ARU BEACH HOTEL. (B)

DAY 11~THURSDAY~MAY 17

MONSOPIAD CULTURAL VILLAGE/MAMUTIK ISLAND Half an hour's drive takes you from the city to the countryside with a landscape of rice fields, water buffaloes and thatched roof wooden houses. Nestled beside the Penampang River are the many traditional buildings that make up the Monsopiad Cultural village, a living museum. The village was built to commemorate the legendary Kadazan-Dudun headhunter warrior called Monsopiad.

Traditionally rice cultivators living on the west coast and interior plains, the Kadazandusun are known for their peace-loving nature and hospitality. Monsopiad, however, would be an exception as he became the one warrior in Kuai-Kandazon to retaliate against thugs who made continuous raids on his village. His total tally was 42 heads before he himself was eventually set upon by his own people to quell his bloodlust. Today, these skulls are kept by his seventh generation in the 'House of Skull' near the Cultural Village. Your trip includes a visit to the Monsopiad Cultural Village, which was created to honor the heroic deeds of this warrior in defending his people, and which will give you insights into native cultural identities.



A short ride of 15 minutes by speed boat takes you to the Tunku Abdul Rahman Marine Park, a unique maritime park comprising five idyllic islands - Manukan, Mamutik, Sapi, Sulug and Gaya. The park is home to the bearded pig, scaly pangolin, squirrels, and monkeys. Snakes and monitor lizards make up the reptile population. Large birds such as the white-breasted sea eagle, pied hornbill and green heron are found in large numbers, while smaller varieties such as the sandpiper, pink-necked green pigeon, bulbul, flycatcher, sunbird and swiftlets also flourish within the tranquil park environment.



Mamutik Island is one of the beautiful coral islands of the Tunku Abdul Rahman Marine Park. The colorful and delicately beautiful corals are living organisms that feed on the plankton floating in the sea, and are home to many different kinds of fish in all shapes and colors of the rainbow. Spend your day sunbathing, swimming, snorkeling, diving, or take a short nature trail to go around the island. Return to the resort in the afternoon.

Tonight, experience dining in the ambience of Kota Kinabalu's only lakeside floating seafood restaurant, the Kampung Nalayan, which is anchored within a botanical park, while being entertained by a "Malaysia cultural and variety show" performed by professionals on a floating stage with traditional Malay architecture. Overnight at the SHANGRI-LA TANJUNG ARU RESORT & SPA. (B,L)

DAY 12~FRIDAY~MAY 18

KOTA KINABALU/MT. KINABALU/PORING HOTSPRING

Depart this morning for your three hours drive to Poring Hot Springs. En route, make a stop at Nabalung village to savor local fruits and bargain prices for the handicrafts. Observe flora and fauna from the canopy walkway situated 100 feet above the forest floor, where you will see the tallest tree in the world; the tualang, which reaches to heights of 250 feet (30 stories) and is characterized by disk-shaped honeycombs hanging from its branches. Two species of the Rafflesia, one of the rarest, and largest, species in the world, may be found in the Poring Hot Springs area. You will have lunch at a Poring Spring local restaurant. Continue with your visit to Kipungit Waterfall and then take a dip in one of the soothing, steaming sulfuric mineral springs set amid beautifully landscaped gardens. You may also want to visit the Poring Orchid Conservation Center, which has the largest collection of Sabah orchids of approximately 500 varieties, with many being rare and endangered; it includes an Orchid Centre lab that utilizes micro-propagation to aid in conserving orchid and pitcher plant species.



Your home for the next two nights is situated atop a hill approximately 5,000 feet above sea level that has a commanding view of the majestic Mt. Kinabalu. Each modern guestroom offers private bathroom, hair-dryer, color television, in-house movies, and coffee/tea making facilities.

Overnight at the MOUNT KINABALU HERITAGE RESORT. (B,L,D)

DAY 13~SATURDAY~MAY 19

KINABALU NATIONAL PARK~SECOND SHELTER NATURE WALK/MOUNTAIN GARDEN



An early morning birding walk in the cool mountain air refreshes you for the day ahead. Transfer to the Timpohon Gate and trek up to the second shelter along the mountain trail (there are seven shelters to the summit). This particular trail provides good opportunities for bird watching. Keep an eye out for the oddly-shaped Low's pitcher plant and walk beneath flowering rhododendrons hanging from the branches of trees, along with small ferns and tiny orchids. Return to Park Headquarters in time for a nature walk with a Park naturalist. Following lunch at the Park's restaurant, visit the botanical garden to take in the fragrant beauty of roses and orchids, and possibly stop at the vegetable market. Overnight at the MOUNT KINABALU HERITAGE RESORT. (B,L,D)

DAY 14~SUNDAY~MAY 20

KOTA KINABALU/KUALA LUMPUR

Return to Kota Kinabalu and connect to your flight to Kuala Lumpur where you will overnight at the Renaissance Hotel.



The luxury five-star Renaissance Kuala Lumpur Hotel is located in the heart of Kuala Lumpur's prestigious Golden Triangle, at the corner of Jalan Ampang and Jalan Sultan Ismail, amid the city's major commercial, financial, shopping and entertainment district. It is a short stroll to the Kuala Lumpur City Centre area, Petronas Twin Towers and Kuala Lumpur Tower. Amenities are as bountiful as the vitality of Malaysia's capital. Spacious rooms include high-speed Internet, safe, mini-bar and plush bedding. The on-site restaurants have won several awards for their service and cuisine. DAYS 15/16~MONDAY/TUESDAY~MAY 21/22

KUALA LUMPUR/LOS ANGELES/INDIANAPOLIS

Today, return to the airport where you catch your flight to Los Angeles via Hong Kong. En route, you will cross the International Date Line and regain your lost day, arriving in Los Angeles on the same day as you left Malaysia. Arrive late afternoon and continue on your overnight flight home.

DAYS 1/2~ WEDNESDAY/THURSDAY~ MAY 2/3

INDIANAPOLIS/LOS ANGELES / EN ROUTE

Depart Indianapolis for Los Angeles where you connect with your late night Malaysia Airlines flight to Kota Kinabalu. En route, you'll cross the international dateline and lose one calendar day. (Meals Aloft)

DAY 3~FRIDAY~MAY 4

TAIPEI/KUCHING

Your flight arrives in Taipei this morning, where you connect with your flight to Kuching, the capital and cultural center of Sarawak state nestled in the northern part of Borneo. Your deluxe hotel is situated in the heart of the city and overlooks the Kuching River, dotted with Sampans and lined with a colorful boardwalk where local families promenade after dinner. Your evening is at leisure to relax.

Overnight at the HILTON KUCHING. (B)



DAY 4~SATURDAY~MAY 5

KUCHING

This morning, discover the charms of this riverside city established by Sir James Brooke, the first White Rajah of Sarawak. See buildings dating back to the days of the White Rajahs, ancient Chinese temples, and colorful markets displaying the produce that first brought traders to Borneo. A visit to Kuching will not be complete without making a stop at the Sarawak Museum. Completed in 1891, the museum has an excellent collection of Bornean ethnological and archaeological artifacts and is reputed to be the best in Southeast Asia.



Kuching is culturally very interesting and the best way to see it is to walk the Main Bazaar. You will pass countless Chinese and Indian merchants, Malay schoolgirls, and old women inside treasure troves, which have disappeared from most of the world. Dozens of spices, in huge glass jars, mix easily with saris from Madras, tins of corned beef, bottles of Worcestershire sauce, and cassettes of the latest Malaysian pop song. You will have lunch at a local restaurant.

After lunch, depart for the Semenggoh Orangutan Rehabilitation Center, located a short drive from the center of the city. Observe the feeding of orangutans that have been rescued from captivity and are being trained to survive independently and ultimately be

returned to the forest. This evening is at leisure to sample the wonderful array of cuisine here.

Overnight at the HILTON KUCHING. (B,L)

DAY 5~SUNDAY~MAY 6

KUCHING/MENYANG TAIS LONGHOUSE

Depart on your four-hour journey through rural Sarawak, passing pepper gardens, cocoa and rubber plantations. En route, visit the colorful native market in Serian town where a variety of jungle produce such as edible ferns, bamboo shoots and unusual tropical fruit are on display. Visit a pepper garden and stop by to view wild orchids and several species of pitcher plants. After lunch en route, arrive at the Lemanak River where you will proceed by



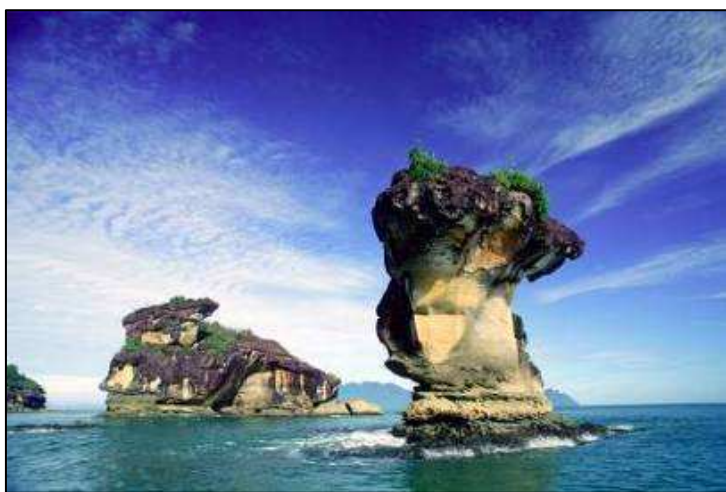
longboat for a one-hour journey upriver to the longhouse, home of the Iban tribe. After dinner, visit the longhouse and relax on the ruai (a common verandah) and spend some time with the Iban people. Learn about their culture and enjoy some local rice wine. The longhouse is built from ironwood or softwood on stilts comprising of a long communal hall and verandah. A row of bilik bilik (rooms) represents the number of families staying in this longhouse. It is fascinating to observe the lifestyle that takes you back centuries in time. The natives here still spin cotton, weave the pua (traditional cloth), hunt with blowpipes, dance to the music of the traditional gongs, and drink tuak. You will cherish this opportunity to interact directly with a culture that is far different than your own. You will be a guest of the village chief (Tuai Rumah). Overnight at the MENYANG TAIS LONGHOUSE. (B,L,D)

DAY 7~MONDAY~MAY 7

MENYANG TAIS/RAIFOREST WALK/KUTCHING

Following breakfast, depart for a short jungle walk around the village area or to visit one of the local farms nearby. Return to the longhouse and continue by boat to Batang Ai Reservoir jetty, then overland back to Kuching and your home at the Hilton.

Overnight at the HILTON KUCHING. (B,L)



DAY 8~TUESDAY~MAY 8

BAKO NATIONAL PARK

Your short drive takes you to Bako Village. By fast boat this morning, cross over to Bako National Park, the best location in Sarawak to see a variety of wildlife. Set in the delta northeast of Kuching, Bako National Park is a glimpse of a tropical coastal ecosystem that once surrounded most of the equatorial coasts of the world.

Lush mangroves give way to soaring rainforest to short desert-like scrubs similar to the outback of Australia and dotted by carnivorous pitcher plants. Nearly 20 miles of walking tracks weave throughout Bako, Borneo's oldest national park. The park has been called one of Borneo's best short-visit wildlife experiences. From Telok Assam, park headquarters, hornbills are common in the treetops

while large monitor lizards scavenge the forest floor and wild boars come around to be fed. Three species of primates are a guarantee – long-tailed macaques, silver-leaf monkeys, and the proboscis monkey; this is the best place in the wild to see the proboscis monkey (other than Sukau River). Boardwalks through the mangroves provide an excellent opportunity for you to examine one of the most endangered habitat-types in the world at close hand. In Bako, all three red, black and white mangroves are found. As you might imagine in the varied habitats that Bako offers, bird watching is excellent with over 200 species of land and water birds. Return to Kuching in the afternoon. Tonight, you may wish to sample some local cuisine on your own.
