INDIANAPOLIS PRIZE

The world's leading award for animal conservation

First awarded in 2006, the Indianapolis Prize is given every other year to an individual who has made extraordinary contributions to wildlife conservation. Established to bring the world's attention to their victories, the Prize elevates the brave, talented and dedicated men and women who spend their lives saving the Earth's wildlife.

A Nominating Committee and Jury — comprised of world-renowned conservation experts, as well as local representatives — choose the Finalists and Winner from a slate of internationally recognized conservationists. The Winner receives an unrestricted cash grant of \$250,000. Each Finalist receives \$50,000.

A new addition to the 2023 Prize is the Emerging Conservationist Award. The Emerging Conservationist award – made possible through a grant from the Kobé Foundation – is a biennial award recognizing conservationists under 40 years of age with the talent and drive to make a significant impact on saving an animal species or group of species. Established to help support their work, the Emerging Conservationist Award aims to encourage courageous, talented and dedicated people who devote themselves to protecting Earth's wild things and wild places. The Winner of this award will receive a \$50,000 project grant to further their conservation work.

No other wildlife conservation award has come close to the Indianapolis Prize's impact.

Local and Global Influence

Across the globe, Indianapolis is becoming known as a leader in wildlife conservation. With each 2-year cycle the Indianapolis Prize continues to expand its reach nationally and internationally.

Each Prize cycle reaches two (2) billion people, in more than 30 countries such as Australia, Brazil, China, India, Italy, Kenya, Netherlands and Pakistan, through print, broadcast and online media. Media tours, to celebrate Winners over the years, has taken the Prize to high-profile locations including the New York Stock Exchange, Times Square and the Natural History Museum in the United Kingdom.

The Indianapolis Prize Gala

The accomplishments of the Indianapolis Prize Winner and Finalists and the Emerging Conservationist Award Winner are celebrated at a spectacular black-tie event for 1,200 influential guests hosted in downtown Indianapolis. Featuring original films shot on location with the Winner and Finalists, the Indianapolis Prize Gala is an unforgettable night of storytelling, inspiration and celebration. The evening transports Gala guests to the world's wildest places, where they share in the victories of those who are saving imperiled species. The Indianapolis Prize Gala has been presented by Cummins Inc. since 2010.

The evening's honors are not only reserved for scientists. The Jane Alexander Global Wildlife Ambassador Award is presented to someone who has been a powerful and effective voice for conservation and who has been a passionate advocate for wildlife.

Well-known actors and wildlife advocates Jane Alexander, Kristen Bell, Josh Duhamel, Harrison Ford, Sam Waterston, Sigourney Weaver, and Alfre Woodard have lent their voices and passion for animal conservation to the Indianapolis Prize and Gala.
