



Apply for a Global Center for Species Survival Field Conservation Grant

Step 1: Create or login to a Blackbaud account

If you have a Blackbaud account

If organizations already have a Blackbaud account, log in as normal. The link will take you to the grant application.

If you do not have a Blackbaud account

If an organization does not have an existing Blackbaud account, click on “Create account” next to the “Sign in” button.

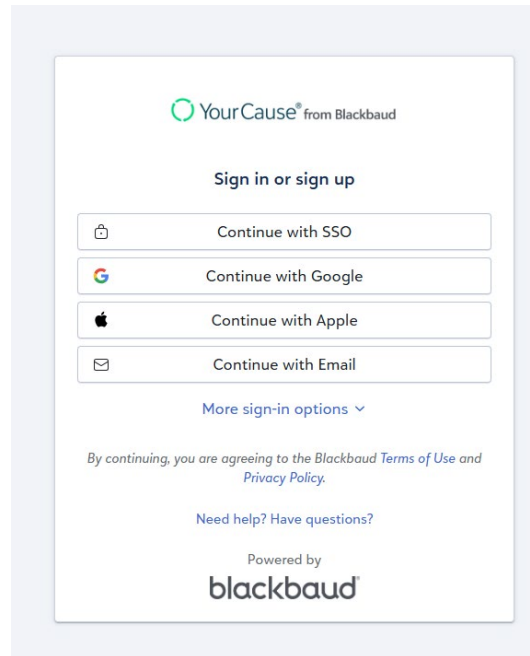

Step 2: Select a sign in method


Select which sign on method you would like to use. The Indianapolis Zoo suggests you sign in with your organization's email address as opposed to a personal email address.



Step 3: Follow the sign on instructions

Follow the sign on instructions and create a secure password. Once you enter your email, you will be prompted to have a confirmation code sent to you. After confirming the code, you will create your password and add your name. Be aware of the listed password requirements.



Wild Futures are small conservation grants of a one-time award of up to USD \$5,000. The Indianapolis Zoo recognizes the value that smaller grants can bring to conservationists. The Wild Futures grants also aim to support students and early career professionals with projects that further conservation.

These awards are open to all applicants affiliated with a non-profit, government agency, university or a foreign not-for-profit equivalent. The Zoo does not offer conservation grants to unaffiliated individuals.


Wild Futures projects can span the entire conservation process, from species discovery or rediscovery to species assessment, planning and action, as well as communication and networking.


Step 5: Finding your organization

Search for your organization's name. The system may take a minute to load.

Step 6: Complete the application

If Blackbaud populated your organization, you can begin the application. It will auto populate with information about your organization.

If you had to add your organization, you will have to enter your organization's information before continuing.

You are ready to apply. You only need to create an account once, as you will use it to apply to all future Indianapolis Zoo Field Conservation Grants. Once you have a primary applicant on the application, they can add applicants to the application, and then those added applicants can create a unique Blackbaud login **USING THE SAME EMAIL ADDRESS THAT WAS INCLUDED BY THE PRIMARY APPLICANT** in the "Manage Applicants" menu. This allows collaboration on a single application without sharing accounts.
